Palm Coast, Leesburg, Deland, St. Johns County and the St. Johns River Water Management District are continuing the investigation of seawater desalination as an alternative water supply to meet future demand. Seawater desalination is under investigation because future groundwater withdrawals in the region will be limited to protect the environment and ensure a sustainable resource. Alternative water supplies must be developed to reduce reliance on groundwater supplies and to meet the public's future drinking water needs.
